## The M5® One-Minute Screener: A Self-Administered Depression / Anxiety Scale for Adults

<b>Background</b> . The M5° is a brief self-assessment of current mood functioning. It is intended for adults, ages 18 and older. This screener is designed to be completed in less than one minute and can be used by adults at home or in any setting. It is effective as a screening tool for depressive or anxiety symptoms that may interfere with everyday functioning, but it should not be used to make a diagnosis of clinical depression or anxiety disorder. Instead, it can indicate when a formal mood assessment is needed. The M5° can be completed by the patient or knowledgeable caregiver or family member. The M5° does not ask questions about self-harm. If you have thoughts of hurting yourself, hurting others, or destroying property, you should immediately seek professional help. If you have a persistent belief that you would be better off not alive, you should seek professional help.
